

# Memorial tournament back for another year of fundraising and fun

The golf tournament is held in the memory of Lindsay Kimmett, who was killed in a February 2008 car accident, and

raises money for scholarships and youth sports programs.

Taylor Kimmett said the tournament is very important to the family.

It's a way to continue her legacy, he said. We wanted to help out and use her name to help people out.

The golf course will be converted into a series of

par-3 holes, ranging in length from 50 yards to 165 yards, with hole-in-one opportunities at each hole.

We don't want to exclude anyone. Even non-golfers can come and have fun, Taylor said.

Big prizes will be up for grabs. The Kimmett family will also be presenting photos from their African trip to climb

Mount Kilimanjaro, a feat Lindsay had previously accomplished.

Following in her footsteps, the family scaled the mountain, and will share the experience with a slideshow.

It was cool to be in the same place that she had been, Taylor said.

There was \$108,000 raised last year and donated to the Spray

Lake Sawmills Recreation Society for two new arenas. The tournament runs Oct. 3 at the Cochrane Golf Club.
